Dale Surowitz is the Chief Executive Officer at Providence Tarzana Medical Center. In 1997, Dale became the CEO of what was known as Encino-Tarzana Regional Medical Center in 1997. In 2008, he played an integral role in assuring the Tarzana campus was acquired by Providence and became the ministry which is known as Providence Tarzana Regional Medical Center. This transition from an investor owned, for profit institution, to a not for profit, faith based hospital of Providence Health and Services is one of the first hospitals in the State to accomplish this transition.

The hospital is about to embark on a \$540 Million campus replacement project which will be completed in 2022. Some of the renowned programs and services at Providence Tarzana include a joint venture with Children's Hospital Los Angeles which together provide 24 hour in-house physician coverage for the Pediatric and Pediatric Intensive Care units as well as the Neo-natal Intensive Care unit. The hospital has developed outstanding clinical programs in Women's Services, Cardiology, Vascular Services, and numerous other clinical areas. This has resulted in national recognition for a variety of clinical services including the distinction of being the only Providence hospital to receive the HealthGrades Top 100 Hospitals in America three years in a row.

Dale has been involved in many civic organizations including serving on the Boards of the Encino and West Valley/Warner Center Chamber of Commerce and was formerly a Board member of the Chambers of Commerce in Universal City /North Hollywood, Sherman Oaks and Encino. Currently, he is the Chair of the United Chamber of Commerce and a Board member of the Foundation of California State University-Northridge, Valley Industry and Commerce Association, and the Senior Services and PACE programs for the Jewish Home for the Aging. Over the years, some of his awards have included: 2016 Fernando Award for Volunteerism and Community Service, Business Person of the Year - Encino Chamber of Commerce, Jewish Home for the Aging - Circle of Life Award, the Joseph Staller Award for Community Service from the Tarzana/Woodland Hills Chamber of Commerce and was a recipient of the San Fernando Valley Business Journal - Healthcare Excellence Award and 25 Most Influential Business Leaders Award. He and his wife, Brenda, are both longtime residents of Tarzana.
